


Castles miniature sheet Marking the 50th

TO COMMEMORATE the 50th anniversary of the first Castles high values, a miniature sheet bearing the 1955 designs will go on sale from 22 March. The sheet includes two 50p stamps showing Carrickfergus and Windsor Castles and two £1 stamps showing Caernarfon and Edinburgh Castles. The stamps are printed in the same colours (brown, red, blue and black) as the 1955 stamps which were of 2s6d, 5s, 10s, and £1 values and featured respectively Carrickfergus, Caernarfon, Edinburgh, and Windsor Castles. The original stamps were designed by Lynton Lamb (1907-77), and featured the portrait of The Queen by Dorothy Wilding. The miniature sheet includes the national floral emblems of England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland in the sheet borders. Similar miniature sheets were issued in December 2002 and May 2003 to mark the 50th anniversary of the issue of the Wilding low value definitives.

FIRST DAY FACILITIES Unstamped Royal Mail FDC envelopes will be available from main post offices and philatelic outlets about a week before 22 March, price 25p. Orders for FDCs with the stamps cancelled by a pictorial first day postmark of Tallents House Edinburgh or Windsor must reach Tallents House by the date of issue. Price £3.88 UK or £3.36 overseas.

Collectors may send stamped covers on the day of issue to: Royal Mail Tallents House, 21 South Gyle Crescent, Edinburgh EH12 9PB (Tallents House postmark) or to their nearest Royal Mail Special Handstamp Centre (Windsor postmark), marking the outer envelope 'FD0509' or 'FD0510'. Covers can be posted or handed in at main Post Office branches for the Windsor postmark.
